## WHY THIS MATTERS NOW

A debate over **India's Myanmar policy** weighs engagement against isolation, driven by **border security, connectivity and competition with China**. For an aspirant, this is a GS2 case on India's **neighbourhood policy, the Act East policy, and the interests-versus-values tension** in foreign policy.

## THE CRUX IN 60 WORDS

India engages Myanmar's military government pragmatically because a **porous shared border** ties its northeast's security to events across it, **connectivity projects** (Kaladan, the Trilateral Highway) run through Myanmar, and **isolation would cede ground to China**. The cost is the values concern of engaging a military regime. The Government of India's course is **calibrated engagement**, balancing interests with values.

## THE ANALYSIS: WHY GEOGRAPHY DECIDES

- 1 Border security.** A porous frontier ties the northeast's stability to events in Myanmar, making a working relationship necessary.
- 2 Connectivity.** The Kaladan project and Trilateral Highway run through Myanmar and underpin Act East.
- 3 The China factor.** Disengagement would cede strategic space to a deeply embedded China.
- 4 The values tension.** Engaging a military government sits uneasily with India's democratic identity.

## DATA AND INSTITUTIONS VAULT

India shares a long land border with Myanmar across several northeastern states; the **Free Movement Regime** along it has been under review. **Connectivity:** the **Kaladan Multi-Modal Transit Transport Project** (linking Kolkata to Sittwe port and onward to Mizoram) and the **India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway**. **The policy:** the **Act East policy** and India's **Neighbourhood First** approach. **Concept:** strategic autonomy; interests versus values; the security-connectivity nexus.

## THE DEBATE

**Argument for engagement:** Border security, connectivity and the need to counter China make a working relationship with Myanmar's authorities a practical necessity; isolation helps no one.

**Argument for caution:** Engaging a military government legitimises it and sits uneasily with India's democratic values and the suffering of Myanmar's people.

## HOW TO THINK ABOUT IT

Frame the answer around **interests versus values**, with geography (a shared, porous border) tilting the balance toward engagement. Set out the three interests (security, connectivity, China) and the values concern, then argue for **calibrated engagement** that keeps humanitarian and people-to-people channels open. Reflect the Government of India's stance.

## THE DIAGRAM IN WORDS

Picture two houses sharing a long, broken fence. One can disapprove of the neighbour, but the fence still leaks, and a third, larger neighbour is already fixing his side of it to his own advantage. Mending the shared fence requires talking to whoever lives next door.

India favours pragmatic engagement with Myanmar's military government over isolation, driven by border security, the Kaladan and trilateral-highway connectivity projects and strategic competition with China, reflecting the Government of India's interest-led neighbourhood approach while managing the attendant trade-offs.

Pursue calibrated engagement that secures the border and connectivity, sustains humanitarian and people-to-people links, supports an inclusive political settlement, and keeps channels open to all stakeholders, balancing interests with values.

**INTRODUCTION**

Foreign policy toward a troubled neighbour is rarely a choice between clean options. India's approach to Myanmar is a study in how interests and values pull against each other, and why geography often decides the direction.

**BODY**

India shares a long, porous border with Myanmar, and the stability of its own northeast depends in part on what happens across it: insurgent sanctuaries, arms and drug trafficking, and refugee flows all cross that frontier. This geographic fact makes a working relationship with whoever controls Myanmar's territory a practical necessity rather than a preference.

Layered on top are connectivity stakes. The Kaladan Multi-Modal Transit Transport Project and the India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway are meant to link the landlocked northeast to the sea and to Southeast Asia, anchoring the Act East policy; they run through Myanmar and depend on a degree of cooperation.

And there is the strategic calculus: China has deepened its economic and strategic footprint in Myanmar, so Indian disengagement would cede ground to Beijing without improving conditions on India's own border. Set against these interests are real values concerns: engaging a military government can appear to legitimise it and sits uncomfortably with India's democratic identity and the plight of Myanmar's people.

The Government of India's approach has been to manage this tension through calibrated engagement, working with the authorities on security and connectivity while sustaining humanitarian and people-to-people links and supporting, in principle, an inclusive political settlement. It is not a morally clean posture, but it is a recognition that on a shared border, isolation is a luxury an interested neighbour cannot afford.

**CONCLUSION**

India's Myanmar policy reflects the primacy of border security and connectivity tempered by values. Calibrated engagement, not isolation, is the course geography and strategy dictate.


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
