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WHY IN NEWS

World Population Day is observed every year on . The **2026 theme** focuses on young people's hopes and aspirations, "**Realizing the hopes and aspirations of young people, today and for the future,**" drawing on a UNFPA *Demographic* (<https://ujjari.com/vocab/demographic/>) Futures survey. The observance comes as India, the world's most populous country, records fertility at or below replacement level and sharply diverging regional trends.

BACKGROUND: HOW THE DAY BEGAN

World Population Day has been observed since **1989**, when it was instituted by the **Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP)**. It was inspired by the public interest generated by the "**Five Billion Day**" of **July 11, 1987**, the date on which the world's population was estimated to have crossed **five billion**. The day is anchored today by the **United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA)**, the UN's sexual and reproductive health agency, which uses it to focus attention on population issues such as family planning, gender equality, maternal health and human rights.

The **2026 framing** marks an important conceptual shift. Instead of treating population as a number to be **controlled**, the theme centres on the **aspirations** of the young, on whether people are able to have the number of children they want, when they want, and whether the young can realise their goals in education, work and family life. This is a move from a **population-control paradigm** (<https://ujjari.com/vocab/paradigm/>) to a **reproductive-rights and choice** paradigm.

INDIA'S DEMOGRAPHIC PICTURE

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India is the **world's most populous country**, with a population of about **1.46 billion** according to the **UNFPA State of World Population 2025** report. Yet its **Total Fertility Rate** (<https://ujjayari.com/terms/total-fertility-rate/>) (**TFR**), the average number of children a woman is expected to have, has fallen to **at or below the replacement level of 2.1**. Replacement-level fertility is the rate at which a population exactly replaces itself from one generation to the next; below it, and absent migration, a population eventually begins to shrink and age.

THE KERALA SIGNAL

The clearest sign of this transition is **Kerala**. The state's **Crude Birth Rate (CBR)**, the number of live births per 1,000 population in a year, is reported to have fallen to about **9.64 in 2024**, down from about **11.06 in 2023**, crossing **below 10 for the first time**, with **Alappuzha** district recording the lowest rate. By contrast, the **national CBR** stands at about **19** per 1,000 according to the Sample Registration System (SRS). Kerala thus shows fertility levels comparable to ageing developed economies, even as other states remain demographically younger.

ANALYSIS AND WAY FORWARD

India's challenge is now **two-sided**. Some states have fertility well below replacement and face **population ageing**, shrinking workforces and rising old-age dependency; others still have younger age structures and growing labour forces. This divergence has **federal implications**: any future **delimitation** (<https://ujjayari.com/vocab/delimitation/>) of Lok Sabha seats on population could reward high-fertility states and penalise those, like Kerala, that succeeded in stabilising their populations, raising questions of fairness in representation.

The policy task is to **harness the demographic dividend** (<https://ujjayari.com/terms/demographic-dividend/>), the window in which the working-age share is large, through education, skilling, health and jobs **before ageing sets in**, while respecting reproductive rights rather than reverting to coercive targets. The 2026

theme's emphasis on young people's aspirations captures exactly this: a growing economy must give the young the means to realise their goals
