India's private spacetech sector has raised approximately \$871 million across 241 funding rounds involving 285 companies as of July 2026, with Skyroot Aerospace becoming the sector's first unicorn at a valuation of about \$1.1 billion.

THE 2020 LIBERALISATION AND WHAT CHANGED

Before 2020, India's space activity was almost entirely the domain of **ISRO**, the government space agency, with limited scope for private firms to design, build, launch or operate space assets independently. The **New Space Policy** framework, and the creation of **IN-SPACe** in 2020, restructured this relationship along functional lines:

BODY	ROLE
ISRO	Research and development, government space missions, technology development
IN-SPACe	Regulatory authorisation, promoting and facilitating private-sector space activity
NewSpace India Limited (NSIL)	ISRO's commercial arm, handling commercial launches and technology transfer to industry
Private companies	Now permitted to build and launch their own rockets, satellites and space-based services, subject to IN-SPACe authorisation

This three-way division, ISRO for research, NSIL for commercialising ISRO's own technology, and IN-SPACe for authorising and enabling wholly private ventures, is the structural basis on which firms like Skyroot have been able to develop and launch privately-built rockets within the Indian regulatory framework, rather than only building components for ISRO missions.

WHY SKYROOT'S UNICORN STATUS MATTERS

A **unicorn** is a privately held startup valued at \$1 billion or more. Skyroot Aerospace becoming India's first spacetechn unicorn, within roughly six years of the sector opening to private participation, and following its own privately developed orbital-class rocket launches, is read as a signal that institutional and venture investors now view Indian spacetechn as a commercially credible, not merely research-stage, sector.

WHAT COMES NEXT: FROM FUNDING TO APPLICATIONS

The policy commentary accompanying this funding milestone typically notes that early-stage capital inflow, while a necessary signal of investor confidence, is not by itself sufficient to build a durable commercial space sector. The next phase of policy attention is expected to shift toward downstream questions: whether Indian launch providers can achieve cost-competitiveness against established international players, whether satellite-based services (communications, earth observation, navigation) built on this infrastructure find sustainable commercial customers, and whether India's regulatory and spectrum-allocation frameworks keep pace with the sector's growth.
