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Trapped Behind the Scam: Human Trafficking's New Frontier

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The UN's World Day against Trafficking in Persons was observed on July 30, 2026, with the 2026 theme "Trapped Behind the Scam," spotlighting victims trafficked into forced labour running online scam-centre operations.

WHAT "TRAFFICKING FOR FORCED CRIMINALITY" MEANS

Most public understanding of human trafficking centres on forced labour in manual or domestic work, or sexual exploitation. A distinct and rapidly growing category, **trafficking for forced criminality**, involves victims coerced into committing crimes on behalf of their traffickers, most prominently, in the current wave, running online financial-fraud "scam centres."

The pattern documented by international agencies follows a consistent structure: victims respond to fake job advertisements, often for legitimate-sounding roles like customer service, data entry or technical support, typically abroad. On arrival, passports are confiscated, and victims are held in guarded compounds and coerced, through debt bondage, threats or physical violence, into operating online scams, romance fraud, fake investment schemes, and cryptocurrency cons, targeting victims worldwide, including in India.

IOM data (2022-2025)	Assisted over 3,500 victims of trafficking for forced criminality across Southeast Asia
Source countries	Victims from 39 countries , with India among the top source countries , alongside Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Ethiopia, Kenya and Bangladesh
Method	Fake international job offers, followed by confiscation of documents and coercion into running online fraud
Policy position of IOM	Victims should be treated as trafficking survivors , not as criminal offenders, even though they are made to commit the underlying fraud

INDIA'S RESPONSE ARCHITECTURE

India's engagement with this problem spans both its human-trafficking legal framework and its cybercrime infrastructure, since the crime sits at the intersection of both.

INSTRUMENT/BODY	RELEVANCE
Article 23 of the Constitution	Prohibits traffic in human beings and forced labour, enforceable as a Fundamental Right
Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956	India's principal anti-trafficking statute, though focused historically on sexual exploitation rather than the newer forced-criminality pattern
Trafficking in Persons (Prevention, Care and Rehabilitation) Bill	A pending, more comprehensive anti-trafficking bill that has not yet been enacted
Indian Cybercrime Coordination Centre (I4C)	Coordinates the national cybercrime response, including cases where Indian victims are both defrauded by, and in some cases coerced into running, these scam operations
1930 helpline and cybercrime.gov.in	The citizen-facing reporting channel for cyber-financial fraud, increasingly relevant as scam-centre-run frauds target Indian victims directly

The dual challenge for Indian policy is that citizens can appear on **both sides** of this crime type: as victims defrauded by scam-centre operations run out of Southeast Asia, and, in the harder-to-detect cases the IOM's data highlights, as Indians themselves trafficked abroad and coerced into running such operations against others.
