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Supreme Court: Treating Waste Disposal as Solely Sanitation Workers' Job is Constitutionally Unethical

*The **Supreme Court**, in a ruling dated **August 18, 2026**, held that treating waste disposal as solely the responsibility of the sanitation workforce, while citizens generate waste passively without accountability, is **constitutionally unethical**, and directed school curricula to integrate waste-management education.*

What the Court Directed

The Bench held that municipal bodies may disconnect water and power supply for **repeated Solid Waste Management (SWM) Rules violations**, and that citizens bear a shared constitutional responsibility for waste generated, not merely the sanitation workforce tasked with clearing it. It directed that waste-management education be integrated into school curricula so the civic duty is instilled from an early age.

The Constitutional Basis

The Court grounded the ruling in **Article 51A(g)** (the fundamental duty to protect and improve the natural environment) and **Article 21** (right to life, interpreted to include a healthy environment), framing indiscriminate, unaccountable waste generation as inconsistent with these constitutional obligations.

UPSC Relevance
